

Columbia Police Department Needs Your Help



The Columbia Police Department needs your help when a crime occurs in your neighborhood. If you have a private surveillance camera system at your residence or business we would like to partner with you. Your private surveillance camera system may provide a piece to the puzzle that could help solve and prosecute crimes. We need to know who is willing to partner with us and the location of your surveillance equipment. **We will not have access to your cameras or security systems. We are only interested in footage you are volunteering to provide.**

The registration process is simple, only takes a few minutes and requests the following:

- ▶ Read the disclaimer and terms of use. ▶ Contact information for the owner and operator of the camera system.
- ▶ Name and address of your location(s). ▶ Details regarding location/view of external security camera system.

Go to www.columbiaillinois.com/465/Surveillance-Camera-Registration for more information and to register. There is no cost associated with registration and your information is confidential. You can delete your registration at any time by contacting the Columbia Police Department.

By registering, the Columbia Police Department will be able to directly contact those residents/businesses with video in an area where a crime occurred. Sharing makes our community safer for everyone!

YARD SALE UPDATE

City residents may now register for yard and garage sales only online at www.columbiaillinois.com/yardsales. There is no charge and no permit necessary to have a sale, but residents are limited to three sales per year. We're pleased to provide you with this simple, digital registration experience which will allow you to register your sale from the comfort of your own home! Sales may be entered any time before your sale begins. There is no deadline; however, it may take up to two business days for your sale to be approved and added to the site. Please double check that you have entered the correct sale dates before submitting your information.

UPCOMING CREEKSIDE PARK

The City of Columbia "20/20" Master Plan encourages the development of parkland including the development of Creekside Park. The City has received an OSLAD Grant (\$400,000) to assist in the development of Creekside Park. The project will consist of the development of over 4,000 lineal feet of walking trail (which will connect the GM&O trail to Rueck Road), pedestrian bridge, parking lot, pavilions, playground area, and storm water detention and/or retention. The City will also be looking at drainage issues in and around Wilson Hills subdivision and looks to make improvements and incorporate them in the park design. Design should begin in June. Per grant guidelines, Creekside Park must be completed in two years.



The City of Columbia is pleased to announce the creation of the, "Yard of the Month" award program to recognize and show appreciation for those residents who demonstrate superior effort in maintaining their property, and who, as a result, positively contribute to the overall appearance of our city.

Through September, the program will award monthly winners to one homeowner in each ward. Each monthly winner will receive a "City of Columbia Yard of the Month" lawn-sign to display in their yard and special recognition by the aldermen in their ward at an upcoming City Council meeting.

Program Guidelines

- ▶ Judging for the award will be provided by the City's neighborhood improvement officer.
- ▶ Awards will be presented for the months of May through September, beginning this year in June.
- ▶ The award term lasts from the first day to the last day of a calendar month.
- ▶ The same property cannot receive more than one award in the same rolling 12 month calendar period.
- ▶ The property of all current residents of the City of Columbia, both owner-occupied and rental, is automatically eligible to participate in the program.
- ▶ The upkeep of the yard can reflect the efforts of the residents themselves or that of a professional landscaper.
- ▶ During their reign as "Yard of the Month," winners are expected to maintain their yard in the same manner that allowed them to win the title.
