Ghent Road

Phase 1 and Phase 2

The Ghent Road Construction Phase 1 is nearly complete. Final items include asphalt surface, striping, and grading/seeding. The city thanks DMS Contracting, Inc. for working with the city and the residents throughout the project phase. A big thanks to the Department of Public Works and Assistant City Engineer Tim Ahrens for their dedication to the project. Ghent Road Construction Phase 2 (Christina Court to Main Street) is currently under final design. Phase 2 improvements include new asphalt, pavement widening, curb and gutter, and sidewalk, and intersection improvements at Ghent and Main. Construction is anticipated late fall or early spring depending on approvals from the Illinois Department of Transportation.

Spring Crime Prevention Tips



The Columbia Police Department would like to help you prevent becoming a victim of avertible crimes. Below are suggestions to keep you and your family safe this Spring:

- Keep your doors locked at all times, including garage doors.
- If opening your windows and sliding doors during the day to enjoy spring weather, make sure to close and lock windows and doors before going to bed or leaving the house.
- Put all ladders and tools back into a secure storage area after use. Make sure to lock any storage unit or shed on your property.
- Be aware of home improvement scams. If you did not solicit the contractor or salesman, do not do business with them.
- Always request identification from utility representatives or salespersons.
- Make sure to lock up personal property such as bicycles, lawn mowers, tools, weed eaters etc. in garage or shed. Keep garage doors closed even when you are home.
- Always remember to roll up vehicle windows, do not leave valuables inside, and lock your doors every time you exit your vehicle, even if the vehicle is on your property.
- Being a good neighbor can be one of the best crime prevention tools. Watchful, attentive neighbors can identify activity that is not "normal" to their neighborhoods. Alert the Columbia Police Department if something doesn't seem right (911 or 618-281-5151).

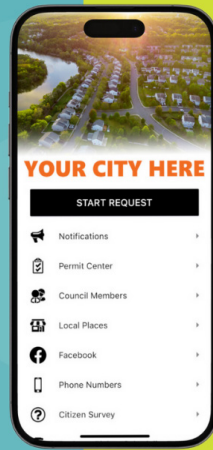

City Hall Urges Residents to sign up for E- Bill and E-Pay for Utilities

Does it seem like some months you get your utility bill late? Unfortunately, that seems to be happening more and more lately, despite the City's efforts. We, at City Hall, understand how frustrating the delay can be, which is why we are urging our residents to sign up for electronic billing. Signing up is a very simple process. Please visit the City's website under the Online Portals & Payments tab, set up your account, fill out the direct debit form and turn it into the payment drop box or Clerk's window at City Hall.

**Did you
know?**

Sheds are a frequent consideration in the Spring, and we want to help answer your shed installation questions. First, make sure to obtain approval for your shed from your HOA. Next, submit a Residential Accessory Building Permit by accessing our on-line portal found on the City website. www.columbiaillinois.com. When applying for the permit remember to attach the HOA approval letter, site plan, and construction plans including foundation details.

Reminder: All sheds must be secured on a permanent foundation.
