Quarry Road Bike Trail Connector Project

The City has just secured a \$200,000 Bike Trail Grant from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources to kick off the highly anticipated Quarry Road Bike Trail Connector Project! This incredible project will extend the existing Quarry Rd. bike trail all the way to Ghent Rd. and feature a brand-new pedestrian bridge over Palmer Creek. By filling in a major gap in the city's trail and sidewalk network, this new addition will make biking and walking around Columbia easier and more scenic than ever before. Once complete, residents will have access to a stunning 3.6-mile loop, connecting Main, Rueck, Quarry, and Ghent Roads – a perfect route for both cyclists and pedestrians to explore!

Spring Crime Prevention Tips



The Columbia Police Department wants to help you avoid preventable crimes. Follow these tips to keep you and your family safe this spring:

- Keep all doors locked, including garage doors
- If you open windows and sliding doors during the day to enjoy spring weather, ensure they are closed and locked before going to bed, or leaving home..
- Store ladders and tools in a secure area, and lock sheds or storage units.
- Be aware of home improvement scams. If you did not solicit the contractor or salesman, do not do business with them.
- Always request identification from utility representatives or salespersons.
- Lock up bicycles, lawn mowers, tools, weed eaters, and other valuables in a garage or shed. Keep garage doors closed even when you are home.
- Lock your vehicle, roll up windows, and never leave valuables inside—even in your driveway.

Be a good neighbor! This can be one of the best crime prevention tools. Watchful, attentive neighbors can identify activity that is not "normal" in their neighborhoods. Stay alert and report suspicious activity to the Columbia Police Department at 911 or 618-281-5151.

Thinking about adding a shed this spring? Here's what you need to know:

- If applicable, get HOA approval before starting City application process.
- Submit a Residential Accessory Building Permit via the City's EPL Licensing Portal at www.columbiail.gov.
- Attach required documents to your permit application, including:
 - HOA approval letter (if applicable)
 - Site Plan
 - Construction Plans (including foundation details)

Reminder: All sheds must be secured on a permanent foundation

Did you know?

City Hall Urges Residents to sign up for E-Billing and E-Payment

Have you noticed delays in receiving your utility bill? Unfortunately, late deliveries are becoming more common. To avoid this frustration, we encourage all residents to sign up for electronic billing.

Signing up is quick and easy! Visit the Online Portals & Payments tab on the City's website, create an account, fill out the direct debit form, and drop it off in the payment drop box or at the Clerk's window at City Hall.
