Spirits were High at Halloween Hi-Jinks

The 2025 Halloween Hi-Jinks in Columbia, Illinois, on Saturday, October 25, was nothing short of magical. A crisp fall morning on Historic Main Street gave way to an afternoon filled with treats, laughter, and community spirit. Families and children visited from 10 a.m. to noon, and enjoyed trick-or-treating at local shops and City Hall, which were bustling with candy stations and welcoming smiles.

The costume contest at City Hall added extra excitement, showcasing everything from imaginative homemade creations to elaborate store-bought ensembles. Classic ghosts and ghouls shared the spotlight with pop-culture favorites and clever mash-ups, making judging both fun and challenging.

With record turnout, candy galore, and one-of-a-kind costumes, Halloween Hi-Jinks 2025 delivered "Halloween done right." The event showcased what makes Columbia special: a community that celebrates together, creates lasting memories, and shares in the joy of the season.

Trail Projects on the Horizon

The Creekside Trail Connector Project was originally scheduled for bidding in November 2025. This initiative includes construction of a pedestrian bridge linking the GM&O Trail to the new Creekside Park Trail, extending the trail to Rueck Road, and providing a sidewalk connection from Creekside Subdivision to the park. The project is partially funded through an Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) Transportation Alternatives Program Grant and is expected to be completed by late 2026.

Meanwhile, the Quarry Road Trail Connector Project remains in the design and permitting phase. It will extend the existing trail along Quarry Road to Ghent Road and include construction of a pedestrian bridge over Palmer Creek, connecting to the existing sidewalk network. The project is supported in part by an Illinois Department of Natural Resources Bike Trail Grant and is also anticipated for completion by late 2026.

IDOT recently announced revisions to its upcoming contract letting schedule. As a result, some projects originally planned for the November letting, including local transportation projects such as these, may be delayed until early 2026. These adjustments are intended to ensure continued access to federal transportation funding. Columbia will continue coordinating with IDOT and its project partners to advance the trail connections as soon as the revised bidding schedule is released.

Winter Driving Safety Tips

As winter weather approaches, we encourage everyone to take extra precautions while driving. Avoid distracted driving and the use of electronic devices; stay focused and aware of your surroundings.



- Reduce speed on icy or snowy roads
 - speed limits are based on normal conditions.
- Use headlights during snow, sleet and rain.
- Watch for "black ice", which can form overnight and cause sudden loss of traction.
- Practice safe maneuvering techniques for icy conditions.
- Maintain at least three times the normal following distance.
- Stay at least 200 feet back from snowplows.
- Exercise caution on bridges, ramps and overpasses, as they freeze first.
- Ensure tires are in good condition, Remember, they're your only contact with the road!

City Prepares for Winter Weather

With winter upon us, the Department of Public Works asks residents to help ensure safe and efficient snow removal by following these guidelines:

- When snow is forecast, please remove vehicles from streets, if possible.
- Avoid placing basketball goals or other objects in or near the street.
- Do not push or throw snow from driveways and sidewalks in to the street.
- During heavy snowfall, primary streets will be cleared first. Secondary and subdivision streets will follow, with cul-de-sacs cleared last.
- Property owners are responsible for cleaning driveway approaches and mailboxes.

Your cooperation helps our crews keep Columbia's streets safe for everyone.



Fall Leaf & Limb Pickup

As the leaves begin to fall, the Department of Public Works will conduct citywide leaf collection sweeps beginning November 10 and continuing through December 19. Please have piles ready by 6 a.m.

Guidelines:

- No grass clippings, shrubs, branches, gumballs, or limbs.
- Place leaves within four feet of the street, behind the curb and sidewalk, in rows — not piles.
- Do not park vehicles in front of leaf piles.
